    - i) ONE - Housing displacement impact studies for development projects? Developers will buy and renovate or rebuild existing properties, which can lead to displacement, particularly among fixed-income seniors. Should these developers be required to submit impact studies on low-income resident displacement before projects are approved?
  
    - ii) TWO - It is likely that homeless youth in schools are undercounted and often underserved. Should additional social workers be hired at high schools and city colleges to help connect them with services?
  
    - iii) THREE - Potential providers have insufficient data on available housing and landlords who will accept vouchers. Can an accessible database be made available to the people and groups who would like to refer at-risk clients to potential housing?
  
- 5) Enlist at least 5 members per subcommittee
  - i) Recommend other content experts or members?
